Parrotfish Class

This week Parrot Fish used their understanding of light to investigate shadows. They were able to predict the size, shape and where the shadow would be based at any time of the day. They then thought of different experiments that they could do to prove their predictions. As part of the Viking topic, they created Viking long ships and shields, using their knowledge from the trip to Murton Park.

Starfish

We have had great fun this week as we have started learning all about our new topic – pirates! We have really enjoyed learning about the different parts on the pirate ships and the reason why a ship requires each part. It is important that we know exactly why a ship has each part because we are soon going to be building our own pirate ship models. How exciting!

Stingray

This week we have entered the world of 'swash buckling' pirates and 'mesmerising' mermaids, as we start our final topic in Year One! The children have planned a variety of activities they would like to complete and are excited about making pirate ships, masks, maps and finding ...treasure! Next week the children will be taking part in a phonic challenge. They have worked hard to learn set 2 and 3 sounds and I know they will do their very best.

Turtle

We are continuing to work hard with their writing and are producing many engaging pieces that are enjoyable to read. They have started looking into their topic of Vikings and they have started to produce watercolour paintings of some Viking Gods. Their drawing has come on a vast amount and they have produced drawings to a high standard!

Jellyfish

Our new topic is 'Down on the farm'. Our role-play area has become a Fruit and Vegetable shop, and we have been finding out how to weigh different fruits and vegetables using the balance scales. We now know when something is the heaviest or the lightest. We have chopped the vegetables ready to make vegetable soup, and used the fruit to help us to draw some beautiful still life pictures. We are also finding out where different fruit and vegetables grow.

Angelfish

Wow! There has been some fabulous, creative pieces of homework brought in by the children in Year 3. They look amazing! Well done to the children who completed it. We had a great cricket lesson on Tuesday led by a cricket coach that the children enjoyed. In Writing, we have begun to write about instructions and how things work- we looked at a funny, fictional text about how a dishwasher really works!

Lobster

In Maths, we have started a new topic on money. The children have been finding amounts of money that are shown pictorial and converting pence into pounds and pence. In computing, the children have created algorithms that have included music and sounds files. The children really enjoyed doing this!

Seahorse

This week, we introduced our new topic - The Secret Garden. We talked about the different plants and animals we might find in our gardens and even discussed how to take care of them. We have made booklets, box gardens and posters to show our learning. In maths, we have added coins together to make different amounts. The children have really impressed us with how they can combine coins in lots of different ways.
